



RECRUITMENT OF TRANSFER PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE PROSPECTS:

Any coaching staff member who has been contacted by or who intends to contact a student-athlete, who is or was enrolled in another four-year college or university must first contact the Assistant Director of Athletics / Compliance Officer / Senior Woman Administrator to request permission to contact that student-athlete.

The Assistant Director of Athletics / Compliance Officer / Senior Woman Administrator will send a written request to contact the student-athlete to the student-athlete's four-year college or university.

The Office of Compliance will immediately notify the SPC coaching staff member of the response of the institution the student-athlete is transferring from.

- **If the student-athlete's institution does not grant us permission** to contact, we may not contact the student directly or indirectly, regardless of who makes the initial contact. Further, we would not be able to award such a transfer student-athlete institutional aid until that student has attended SPC for one academic year.

SPC can not provide an official visit to a transfer prospective student-athlete unless we receive permission to contact that student from his or her previous institution.

TWO-YEAR COLLEGE:

Please note that you do not need a release from a two-year college to contact a prospect attending that institution.

Still, NCAA recruiting rules would prohibit you from having any face-to-face recruiting contact with a non-qualifier who is enrolled in his / her first year at a junior college. You can evaluate, call and write a non-qualifier enrolled in his / her first year at a junior college.
